

Number 1: "An act of God"

"But your eyes have seen all the great **acts of the LORD** which he did. (<u>Deuteronomy</u> <u>11:7</u>)

Israel were reminded of the great acts of God ... the **drowning of the Egyptian army** in the Red Sea ... and so on.

This is what it means to become all things to all men.


