28 general parables and 13 kingdom of heaven parables

Parable #19 - "INVITATION TO A WEDDING"

READ Matthew 22:2-5,6-9,10-13,14

The 11<sup>th</sup> of the 13 kingdom of heaven parables

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In 445BC, with **one Bible week** equating to **seven years** (a prophetic year being 360 days), God commanded that **seventy weeks** each of **7 years**, would be determined upon Israel, that is ... **70 weeks** x **7 years** = **490 years** (<u>Daniel 9:24-27</u>).


This time frame is broken into **four** time periods of (a) **7 weeks** + (b) **62 weeks** + (c) the mystery church age of about 2,000 years + (d) **1 week** = **70 weeks** and is explained as follows:

#1. **Seven** weeks of years is  $7 \times 7 = 49$  years ... the time it takes to restore and build Jerusalem from 445BC to 396BC. #2. Sixty two weeks of years is  $62 \times 7 = 434$  years ... the time from the building of Jerusalem in 396BC to Christ being cut off at the cross #3. The church age of approximately 2,000 years #4. One week of years is  $1 \times 7 = 7$  years ... this is the seven years of tribulation of God's wrath upon the earth, that takes place after the rapture ... called **Daniel's 70<sup>th</sup> week**.

The following **Timeline** will help (not drawn to scale):

### **DANIEL 9:24-27**

"Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city ... from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks ... after threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off ... he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week "



## CHRIST'S REASONS FOR USING PARABLES = "parallels" ... parallel stories

- 1. To illustrate **a truth** by something that is already **familiar** to the hearers. To make known mysteries by comparing with things already known
- 2. They **impart instruction** and **rebuke** without causing offence (the poor man's lamb <u>2</u> <u>Samuel 12:1-4,5-7</u>)
- 3. They **reveal a truth** in an interesting form, and **create more interest** and **hunger** for further information (Matthew 13:10-13,14-17)
- 4. The symbolism of the stories is **always true** and the points illustrated are not false or absurd
- 5. The **historical** background and the circumstances and occasion when uttered must be understood
- 6. Their words and details are to be defined **literally** not spiritually
- 7. The principles of **interpretation** are given by Jesus himself. and any interpretation at variance with these principles and with the purpose of the parable, is unscriptural and illegal.
- 8. **Conceal a truth** from the disinterested and the rebels at heart (Matthew 13:13)

# "THE WEDDING INVITATION" Matthew 22:2-5,6-9,10-13,14

V1 And Jesus answered and spake unto them again by parables, and said, v2 The **kingdom of heaven** is like unto a certain **king**, which made a marriage for **his son**, And sent forth his **servants** to call them that were bidden to the wedding: and they would V4 Again, he sent forth **other servants**, saying, Tell them which are bidden, Behold, I have prepared my dinner: my oxen and my fatlings are killed, and all things are ready: come unto the marriage. V5 But they made light of it, and went their ways, one to his farm, another to his merchandise: V6 And the remnant took his servants, and entreated them spitefully, and **slew them**. V7 But when the **king** heard thereof, he was wroth: and he sent forth his armies, and destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. V8 Then saith he to his servants, The wedding is ready, but they which were bidden were not worthy. V9 Go ye therefore into the **highways**, and as many as ye shall find, **bid to the marriage**. V10 So those servants went out into the highways, and gathered together all as many as they found, both bad and good: and the wedding was furnished with guests. V11 And when the king came in to see the guests, he saw there a man which had not on a wedding garment:

And he saith unto him, Friend, how camest thou in hither **not having a wedding garment**? And he was speechless. V13 Then said the king to the servants, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and **cast him into outer darkness**; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. V14 **For many are called, but few are chosen**.

This parable is given by Christ under the works dispensation of the kingdom of heaven.

#### **EXPLANATION:**

**the kingdom of heaven =** Matthew chapters 5-7 ... see above diagram

king = God the Father

**his son =** Jesus Christ

**servants** = prophets

**other servants =** more prophets

they made light of it, and went their ways = These are they ... Pharisees, Sadducees, elders of Israel

**the remnant ... slew them =** These are they that killed the prophets. Israel has always killed all her prophets ( $\underbrace{Matt \ 25:34-35}$ ).

**king ... sent forth his armies ... destroyed those murderers** = Throughout history, God has sent his armies against Israel. It comes as a surprise that Assyria and Babylon were called God's armies even though God ended up destroying them.

Indeed, the Northern king Jehu killed the devilish Athaliah, who slew all the Southern godly line except for Joash, but he himself went to hell.

**burned up their city =** Jerusalem is burned by Rome around 70AD.

**the wedding is ready =** all arrangements had been made. All that was needed was the quests.

**they which were bidden were not worthy** = These are they of way side, stony and thorn grounds that rejected Christ, and had always murdered the prophets (<u>Matthew 13:4-7</u>)

gathered together all as many as they found, both bad and good ... the wedding was furnished with guests = these were a mixture of stony, thorny and good grounds, all except the way side Jews.

**the king came in to see the guests =** God comes to inspect all those in attendance

a man which had not on a wedding garment = This man was of the stony or thorny ground. He said on the behalf of others "Haven't we cast out devils prophesied in thy name?", but God said "Depart from me, I never knew you." (Matt 7:21-22)

This man getting into the wedding was an impossibility, but it hypothetically outlines the case against the stony and thorny ground Jews wanting to get in, that no-one should even consider attempting to fool God with their deception ( $\frac{\text{Heb 4:12}}{\text{Meb 4:12}}$ ).

**for many are called, but few are chosen =** all the four grounds are called to the wedding, but only the good ground is chosen. The rest are rejected.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

- 1. This **kingdom of heaven** phrase of "many are called but few are chosen", has been **wrongfully** placed into the dispensation of the kingdom of God by Calvinists, to support their satanic T.U.L.I.P. doctrines.
- 2. Many are called in the kingdom of heaven ... the way side, the stony, the thorny, the good ground Jews. Only the good ground Jews had the right garment ... they **continuously believed <u>IN</u>** the Lord Jesus Christ while sacrificing animal blood for the **remission of past sins** ... "Yes Lord, we believe you are fulfilling the law on our behalf!"
- 3. Under the kingdom of God dispensation, these are the pretend Christians ... they look like the real deal ... Mormons, JW's, Catholics, SDA's and often are the Penty's getting filled and so on.
- 4. The ones with the right garment have had the heart surgery as follows

"In whom also ye are circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, in putting off the body of the sins of the flesh by the circumcision of Christ:" (Colossians 2:11)

We are reminded of the following scripture ...

"For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." (Hebrews 4:12)

- 1. Dear Reader have you been **circumcised**? Spiritually or just physically?
- 2. Have you believed **ON** the Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 16:31) or just **IN** him (John 3:16)?
- 3. Do you know the **difference** between the kingdom of heaven and the kingdom of God dispensations?
- 4. Do you think God **weighs** you on a set of scales to get you into heaven?
- 5. Does your **goodness** equal that of the Lord Jesus Christ?
- 6. What are the entry requirements for **heaven**?
- 7. What do you have to do to get into **hell**?

You said if I believe that **Jesus died for my sins** ... you can save me. It's like I'm in this **body of death**.




