A: "Yes!"

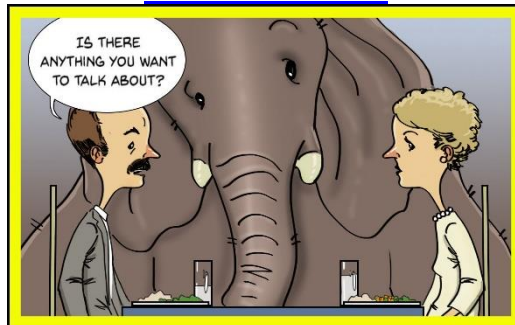
